ENCORA WHAT?

ENCORA Network of Networks offers, as a free service:

- 1. search of partners throughout Europe to learn from mutual experience and to solve problems together
- 2. organisation of workshops to benchmark coastal policies, coastal practice, scientific tools and knowledge
- 3. organisation of exchange visits of young researchers and practitioners

The National Coordination Office will keep you continuously informed about the search progress.


Small questions requiring a rapid answer can be addressed to a Thematic Internet Section of ENCORA, where all theme members can react to their mutual questions.
